Reminder: There is a \$15 processing fee, \$2.50 late fee and 1% interest fee that will be assessed on any outstanding balances due PHCA. To ensure that you do not incur late fees you must have your full payment on time to the address provided.

# "How Do I Know if an Emergency is in Effect in our Community?"

With the recent fire and tornado events in Colorado that have damaged or destroyed homes and have resulted in loss of life, there has been a lot of attention given to reverse 911 systems and notification processes. Survivors of the Conifer wildfire have reminded us that "it is better to be safe than sorry" in any emergency. When you believe there is a danger, it is better to get out than to wait for someone to tell you to do so. However, a call from officials is a good confirmation of certain situations. Given the predictably unpredictable weather in our community, it is a good time to confirm that your phone numbers and information are up-to-date in the Elbert County reverse 911 system.

Elbert County has teamed up with an emergency notification system to provide a service FREE to Elbert County residents. There are three components to this system:

- 1) Reverse Emergency Notification calls
- 2) Weather Warning Notifications calls
- 3) Emergency Management Community updates via email and texting

The CodeRED emergency notification system is a communication service available for emergency and non-emergency notifications. CodeRED employs intranet mapping capable of geographic targeting of calls, coupled with a telephone calling system capable of delivering a pre-recorded message directly to homes and businesses at the rate of up to 60,000 calls per hour. The system's main purpose is to notify citizens or groups of citizens in emergency situations; however the system has the ability to be used for non-emergency notifications as well such as winter storm events, fire ban restrictions or rabies outbreaks.

CodeRED WEATHER WARNING will deliver severe weather warnings to your telephone and/or cell phone within seconds after being issued by the National Weather Service. You will only get the warning if you physically live in the area that is in the warning.

#### How do I know if I'm in the system?

DON'T assume your phone number is in the system, go ahead and sign up on the Internet at www.elbertcounty-co.gov, click on the CodeRED icon. Those who DO NOT have internet access may call 303.805.6131 Monday thru Thursday (7:30 am - 5 pm) to sign up for this service.

#### How many call attempts does the CodeRED dialing system make for each telephone number?

The CodeRED dialing system attempts each record up to 3 times in the first round of calling in order to maximize the number of delivered messages. Multiple rounds of calling can be initiated for those numbers not contacted during the first round.

**Are CodeRED messages only delivered to people who pick up the phone in-person?**CodeRED delivers recorded messages to a live person and to answering devices.

The arena needs to be kept locked at all times. Please make sure that it is locked before you leave.

Covenant Reminder: "Article VI – Restrictions – 7. Livestock. No animals, livestock or poultry shall be allowed either temporarily or permanently, except the following: horses, dogs, cats and other usual and suitable household pets. A maximum of four (4) horses per 5-acre plot will be allowed and four (4) adult dogs and/or cats per household. The above exceptions are for household enjoyment only and shall not be raised, bred or boarded for any commercial purposes. If horses are kept, facilities shall be kept clean and odor free. In order to prevent overgrazing, horses shall be kept in a small corral of not to exceed 25 percent of the lot size and only allowed to occasionally graze in remaining native grass area owned and fenced by owner."

We have had a few homeowners complain to the board regarding junk cars, trailers, and homes with a lot of trash on their property. Since there is nothing in the covenants that pertain to these issues, please contact Elbert County. They have created a new ordinance "Ordinance No. 11-01 – An ordinance regarding the accumulation and removal of rubbish, nuisances, and junked/inoperable motor vehicles in Elbert County, Colorado." These complaints must be directed to Elbert County and not the Board of Directors.
